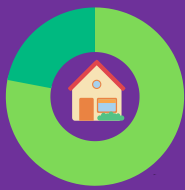


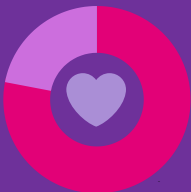


# Parenting in a Pandemic Survey Findings Summary



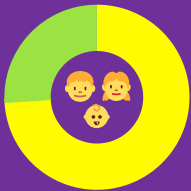
**78%**

## Biggest lockdown challenges for parents...

**63%** of parents felt that the NI Government had not done enough to support or inform parents.

**53%** of parents felt that the UK government had not done enough to support parents.

**48%** of parents said local government had not done enough.

**32%** of all parents were unsure if any layer of government was doing enough.

Parents are evenly split regarding the educational provision for their children during lockdown. 50% feel that provision has been adequate, while 50% do not.

Parents are also relatively split on the idea of schools being one of the first settings to reopen – 42% agree that they should be while 58% do not.
