78%

either agreed or strongly agreed that it had been difficult for their family.



78%

agreed or strongly agreed it had been difficult for them as parents.



74%

agreed or strongly agreed it had been difficult for their children.

63% of parents felt that the NI Government had not done enough to support or inform parents.

53% of parents felt that the UK government had not done enough to support parents.

48% of parents said local government had not done enough.

32% of all parents were unsure if any layer of government was doing enough.

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Other challenges parents and families are struggling with during the pandemic:











50/50

Parents are evenly split regarding the educational provision for their children during lockdown. 50% feel that provision has been adequate, while 50% do not.

Parents are also relatively split on the idea of schools being one of the first settings to reopen – 42% agree that they should be while 58% do not.
